MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 31, S. 2023

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE USE OF LEAD-SAFE PAINTS IN CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE AND RENOVATION PROJECTS AND OTHER ACTIVITIES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF TERESA, RIZAL

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 17 Basic Services and Facilities of Republic Act (R.A) 7160 of the Local Government Code of 1991 states that "...local government units shall likewise exercise such other powers and discharge such other functions and responsibilities as are necessary, appropriate, or incidental to efficient and effective provisions of the basic services...."

WHEREAS, the State as guaranteed by the Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines "shall protect and promote the right to health" and "protect and advance the right of the people to balanced and healthful ecology";

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 6969 or the Toxic Substances and Hazardous and Nuclear Waste Control Act of 1990a and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, affirm the state policy to "regulate, restrict or prohibit the importation, manufacture, processing,

SECTION 11. INFORMATION AND EDUCATION CAMPAIGN. The Municipal Health Office shall conduct a municipal wide information and education campaign on the provisions of the Ordinance, with the assistance of concerned government agencies and Non-Government Organizations.

SECTION 12. BUDGETARY REQUIREMENT. The funds needed for the implementation of the Ordinance shall be taken from the Annual Development Fund or any Supplemental Budget that may be passed for the purpose.

SECTION 13. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If, for any reason, any provision or part of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 14. REPEALING CLAUSE. All Ordinances, Resolutions, local Executive Orders, or Administrative Issuances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of the Ordinance are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SECTION 15. EFFECTIVITY. This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its posting at the Bulletin Board within the Municipal Hall and other conspicuous places in the Municipality.
